The hope is that the broadcasts will enlighten the local public enough to want to visit and re-visit this wonderful and ever evolving museum to help keep it open for future generations to enjoy.

Dom said: "Empowering people with the skills to make radio so they and their organisations have a voice across the region is at the heart of what Somer Valley FM is all about. I am delighted to be working with Miranda and Lucy to ensure our history and heritage has a central place in local radio.

Clashing with his Allied political opponents Dwight Eisenhower (John Slattery) and Field Marshal Montgomery (Julian Wadham), the troubled Churchill receives support and devotion from his wife, brilliant

unflappable Clementine Churchill (Miranda Richardson). With her strength and shrewdness, 'Clemmie' halts Winston's physical, mental and spiritual collapse and inspires him on to greatness.
