CHECK IN...

Robin Moss chaired the meeting. He welcomed everyone and we all said hello to each other for the first time in months! Also present: Marlene Morley, Liam Kirby, Angie Seaman-Moss, Ron Hopkins, Julian Mellor, Rob Wicke. Bev Craney left part way through the meeting. Sue Hill joined at Dragons' Den discussion. Elizabeth Derl-Davis joined but had to leave soon after due to technical difficulties with Zoom / internet.

Covid Response Fund update:

- Hot Square Meal Project Coming to an end. RW gave the headline figures and will circulate a
 full report to the Partnership soon.
- Family Food Parcel Sporting Family Change 2 weeks left to run on this project and they have asked for more funds to take them through to September. RW will ask for more details.
- Small Stuff Baby Bank Just over half way through and service is well used.
- Carers' Calls and Support Packs Carers' Centre they're about 2 weeks in, first feedback due soon.
- Investigating **business support**... the CIC are discussing the options about business support and working towards a proposal for the Partnership.
- RW reminded the Partnership that the funds don't have to be spent quickly the community needs coming from Covid are likely to be longterm.

The Partnership discussed the pros and cons of carrying out a digital Dragons' Den this year. There wasn't much support for it, especially with difficulties ensuring voters are residents. There was a strong preference for a face to face DD in late 2020. It was suggested that RW and JM could spend a bit of time investigating how it would work as a separate event from DD, with a different voting system.
