RW reported on work carried out so far. Thanks given to RW for all the work		
done so far.		
 Notice and thanks have been given to Carers' Centre. Local Trust have been informed. 		
New LTO application has been submitted with documentation, and		
acknowledged by Local Trust, who will submit any further questions in due course.		
Next Steps – identified and circulated prior to the meeting. Next steps proposed by RW in consultation with directors.		
 Local Trust will assess our suitability for the role. They may have further questions or requirements for us to fulfil and will get back to us regarding this. 		
 Once the go-ahead has been given, Carers' Centre will be required to return the funds they hold for the Partnership. 		
 Then we sign a contract with Local Trust to be the LTO. 		
 Local Trust transfers the first payment into our account. RW explained finances and transfers. Bank accounts discussed. 		
Timescales – Up to 3 months, but possible within 1 month (early March is all

6. Projects

Resilience:

Loan – We have been informed by Local Trust that the loan must be paid back by Mar 2025 at the latest, which changes what we can offer Radstock Town Council. The clerk has been informed and she is considering the situation. RW explained the repayment process. Detailed discussion followed.

Radstock Foodies Club – RW reported on progress and meetings. He has met with George Clutten and Alison Todd, CEO of Mercy In Action to discuss the possibility of their involvement in the club, including an option for their organisation taking on the ownership. They run a similar project in Bath (with over 100 members), and are looking at ways they can support communities in the Somer valley.

JWG- We need to ensure the price people pay stays the same and doesn't increase.

Dragons' Den 2023 – RW reported on the progress. Somer Valley Rotary are generously contributing £500 and a dragon again. There have been 2 applications and confirmation that a few more are in development. Becky Brooks and Lucy Slade from the Journal are not available to be Dragons this year.

Well being space- RW reported that feedback is showing that the current charges for use of the well being space are too high, and therefore affecting the usage. Well Being space usage and charges to be discussed at the next meeting. Discussion also needed with Hope house.

Children and Young People: -

Learn to Lead- The program is progressing in Norton Hill. They have run a refresher recently and I am invited to speak with some of the groups after half-term about the Big Local and Dragons' Den.
